God has blessed TABC as we saw from reviewing our heritage. Another truth we learned, as we reviewed our history, is that there have been some difficulties over the more

recent past. This conclusion comes from conversations and records. Does this mean God has stopped working and leading TABC? NO. One common issue found in most of these difficulties has been in the leadership model and structure of TABC. This has been acknowledged time and time again.

Part of the mission of our transition efforts has been to assess our leadership structure against the biblical model and seek to change and make corrections where necessary to fulfill our mission of making disciples that make disciples. Our transition team, deacons and pastors believe the answer to this leadership structure problem is to move from a Senior Pastor single elder model of leadership to a plurality of pastors/elders' model. We find this solution to the leadership issues we have faced in God's word. The teaching in 1 Timothy 5:4 is Jesus is the Chief Shepherd, the Senior (Chief) Pastor (Shepherd), of His church, His bride; and along with the indwelling of the Spirit they guide and lead His congregation of believers with the ministry of two offices, the plurality of pastors/elders and deacons.

The goal of this recommendation is to see a similar work of God as recorded in Acts 6. The congregation in Jerusalem followed the advice of the apostles to appoint seven men to become lead servants to the widows and others. This decision allowed the apostles freedom to devote themselves to prayer and the preaching ministry (v. 3-4). This is how Luke records the results of that change, "And the word of God continued to increase, and the number of the disciples multiplied greatly in Jerusalem, and a greatly many of the priests became obedient to the faith." (Acts 6:7 ESV)

The result of that leadership change is the mission of the church, disciples making disciples. By instituting this change, the ministry flourished. This is the heart of your TIM team, deacons, and pastors. Will you come alongside them and agree to let go of things that have served their purpose and joyfully receive the new biblically inspired leadership model?

Please, take advantage of all the opportunities your leadership team provides to introduce, explain, and answer your questions. Currently, there are two Q&A sessions scheduled for the evening service time, 6:00 pm, on April 6 and April 13. You are very much encouraged to attend.

# The Hope of the Cross: The Fulfillment of God's Perfect Sacrifice

Easter is a time of reflection, gratitude, and celebration. It is the season when we remember the greatest sacrifice ever made, and the victory that changed everything. To fully understand the power of the resurrection, we must first look back at the sacrificial system established in the Old Testament.

From the earliest pages of Scripture, God made a way for sinful people to be reconciled to Him. The sacrificial system, given to Israel through Moses, required the blood of lambs, bulls, and goats to atone for sin. Day after day, year after year, priests offered sacrifices on behalf of the people. But these sacrifices were only temporary. They pointed forward to something—someone—greater.

Jesus Christ was that fulfillment. As John the Baptist declared, "Behold! The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!" (John 1:29, NKJV). Unlike the Old Testament sacrifices that had to be repeated, Jesus' death on the cross was once for all. He became the perfect, spotless Lamb, offering Himself as the final sacrifice. His resurrection three days later proved that His work was complete, that sin and death had been defeated, and that we have eternal hope in Him.

This Easter, we will celebrate these incredible truths together through our special Good Friday service and musical "The Hope of the Cross". On Friday, April 18th, at 7 PM, our church family will come together for

an evening of worship and reflection. Through powerful music and Scripture, we will walk through the story of redemption—from the Old Testament sacrifices to the finished work of Christ. We will also take communion, remembering the body broken and the blood shed for our salvation.

As we prepare our hearts for Easter, let us remember the depth of God's love displayed through the cross. The sacrifices of the past have been fulfilled. The debt of sin has been paid. And because Jesus lives, we have the promise of eternal life.

Join us as we worship, remember, and proclaim together—our hope is found in the cross and His resurrection!

Many people have asked what they can do to help. One of the things many widows suffer from is isolation and loneliness, so if you take time to call and just say "Hello, I'm thinking of you", it would mean so much! An in-person visit would be even more welcome. Many widows find it hard to reach out, and feel overlooked, so your kindness and thoughtfulness could make the difference in someone having a good day or a bad day.

Here are some words of advice from grief counseling. Unless you are a widow, you don't know how a widow feels, so do not say "I know how you feel". We have all suffered loss of a loved one, but being a widow is different than other types of

grief. And contrary to popular belief, we DO want to talk about our spouse. So many time folks are afraid to speak of the departed husband for fear of making grief worse. The opposite is true! Talking about the one that is gone is sometimes very therapeutic. Grief is not something you 'get over'. Grieving people move forward with their lives, but grief is not like an illness that is over. Lives change forever with the loss of a spouse and it takes time to get used to the "new normal". If you don't know what to say, just give the widow a hug! That action is worth a thousand words!





# **Belize Mission Trip**

It has been five years since I have been in Belize. On March 11, 2025, I had the privilege of returning to Belize with a team of TACA students, parents, college students, and medical professionals. My love for Belize all began in 2006 when I was invited to go with a team from Tri-Cities Christian

School and I jumped at the chance! It would be my first short term missions trip and I was more than excited to go. I thought it was "just a trip" and a once in a lifetime experience. That is not what God had in mind at all. It was during that trip that I knew God was calling me to something much bigger. A sense of purpose and clarity washed over me, though it was accompanied by the uncertainty of what the future would hold. Nevertheless, the passion ignited within me was undeniable, and I was eager to embrace it.

Since that first trip, I have led over 25 teams to Belize on mission that included medical teams, construction, students, and pastors, parents and school staff. Some teams had as many as 73 members. We have served hundreds of patients, built more houses that I can remember, led many to the Lord, and made memories and friends that I will keep tucked away for the rest of my life. I never dreamed that accepting that invitation to go would lead to all those years of service.

God is merciful and kind. The idea that He invites us to join Him in serving others is mind boggling but beautiful and exciting! How can it be that He would extend such an invitation to someone who has no idea how to do all those things? He only asks for a willing heart. He will do all the rest. Thank you God that I said yes.

### Families,

I am writing this on my first day back on campus after spending an amazing week on the Mission Trip in Belize. I never dreamed that the trip would have such an impact on my life. Seeing how most of the people of Belize live in poverty, not even having access to what we consider is basics, is heartbreaking and makes you realize how incredibly blessed we are, and honestly, how selfish. I know there are people here who struggle around us, but it is a different type of struggling.


Most of the villages that we visited were in deplorable conditions, had no running water, and if they did it was not clean water. The houses are tiny, more like shacks that are literally held together by old wood and nails, and most of these homes have more than 4 or 5 people living in them, ranging in ages. Many do not have access to medical care, or do not have


the ability to get help if they need it. They also struggle to put food on their tables. It is heartbreaking. But they do not seem to complain. They are thankful for any help, but to them, the way they are living is normal.

During the med clinics we held on the camp we got to meet an array of people as well. Again, many just needed help getting basic care. There were several with uncontrolled high blood pressure, severe pain from untreated arthritis, skin issues due to lack of bedding, and even some just seeking out help for headaches or colds. Again, help with all these conditions is something we take for granted. Most of us have medicines for issues and certainly have Tylenol or ibuprofen on hand.


Another opportunity we had was visiting Marla's House of Hope. It is an orphanage for girls. For me, this was one of the hardest clinics and visits we did. Most of the girls were there because they were

removed from their homes due to abuse, and most had been sexually abused at a very young age. Because of the abuse, you could see fear and discomfort when they were being checked, even though it was literally just a basic checkup. This was also a great opportunity for the young adults and students that were with us to really show Jesus. While we were doing the med clinic, they were outside playing with the kids. It was amazing to see.





Us?' Then I said, 'Here am I! Send me." I am so thankful that God called, and we went. I am also so thankful that I work here on the TABC campus, a campus that understands the command given in Matthew 22:36-40 (NKJV), "Teacher, which is the great commandment in the law? "Jesus said to him, "'You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' On these two commandments hang all the Law and the Prophets." What an incredible experience it was!








